CNY Diaper Bank partners with local social service agencies to provide free diapers to low-income families while raising awareness of diapers as a basic need not being met for all babies.


VISION

We are a proud member of the NYS Diaper Bank Coalition. The purpose of the coalition is to work collectively to ensure that New Yorkers have access to the basic necessities they need to thrive. The coalition works together to support and learn from each other, advocate for policy change and educate on the need for diapers in New York. The group comes together to form a collective voice that works to impact change in communities across the state. In 2023, we successfully lobbied the NYS Legislature to include \$500,000 in funding in the 2023 budget for 16 diaper banks across the state.


